

Experiences

Kids on Course offers enrichment opportunities in a variety of areas including sports, arts and science. Students who show commitment to the Program and a passion for a certain activity are eligible to receive a Bid for Kids scholarship, which helps pay for extracurriculars so they don't have the financial barrier.

This year, we had 98 students participate in extracurricular experiences, including dance lessons, bowling, football, basketball, and more!

Food Insecurities

To address food insecurity within our community, we distributed 17 holiday break food boxes to assist families over winter break.


Over 1,000 after school snacks were provided to KOC students each week.

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Post-Secondary Highlights

As part of the Kids on Course program, students have the chance to experience post-secondary opportunities. This year, the KOC students visited several colleges, including Coe College, Mt. Mercy University, Kirkwood Community College, the University of Iowa, and the University of Northern Iowa. Students also visited trade schools and learned about their programs as a post-secondary education path.

Kids on Course, in partnership with others, hosted a career fair at Jefferson High School that students had the opportunity to attend and explore different career paths.

PREVENTING THE SUMMER SLIDE

Summer learning loss accounts for 2/3 of the achievement gap in the United States. This is why Kids on Course has three academic summer programs for students who are at risk of losing academic skills and becoming further disengaged in learning over the summer. Kids on Course University is for elementary students, Scholar Camp is for middle school students, and High School Academy is for high school students.

Incoming freshman were placed in cooperative learning groups to focus on language arts, math, and executive functioning skills to prepare for high school. Additionally, students volunteered at four sites in the community!



Jonathan's Journey

Jonathan's journey with Kids on Course began in second grade at Van Buren Elementary School. As a Spanish speaker, he initially found himself in English Language Learner (ELL) classes. In a single-parent household with four siblings, Jonathan, the second oldest, was destined to be the second high school graduate in his family. His older brother, Robert, paved the way as part of the inaugural KOC graduates in 2022. Jonathan is the first person in his family to attend college and currently is enrolled at Tallahassee Community College.

Jonathan embraced the full spectrum of opportunities Kids on Course offered. In middle school, he earned a Bid for Kids Scholarship for soccer with CRSA and participated in Learning Lab and Kings Club. In high school, acting on KOC staff recommendations, he structured his schedule to include a study hall for tutoring in the KOC room during the day and attended Learning Lab after school when he wasn't working. "Every time I turned around, another KOC staff was telling me what to do...at the time, it was annoying, but looking back, I know I needed it."

Entering high school, college wasn't on Jonathan's radar. It wasn't until his senior year that he became interested. "The KOC staff told me to do better, so I had more doors open. I wish I had listened more, but it worked out because I love where I am now." During his senior year, a newfound inspiration prompted Jonathan to move across the country and try something new. With Kids on Course guiding him every step of the way, from college applications to navigating financial aid and even preparing for a solo drive to Florida, Jonathan felt supported.

"The biggest thing KOC taught me was how quickly things change. As a freshman, they told us to pay attention because we would grow and change, and if we weren't careful, we would miss opportunities by not paying attention. Then it was like I blinked, and there I was, a senior who had missed opportunities by not paying attention. Thankfully, they were still there to push me forward and help me chase my dreams. I definitely wouldn't be where I am now without KOC."






The 2023 ZJF Classic raised over \$1 MILLION! Thank you to all who contributed and sponsored this great event!

Post Gecondary Engagement Initiatives

Our commitment to post-secondary exposure includes organizing a minimum of 4-5 annual college campus visits exclusively tailored for Kids on Course juniors and seniors. Additionally, we facilitate visits to various trade opportunities and apprenticeship programs to broaden students' perspectives.

Graduating on Time and With a Plan

We prioritize guiding high school students toward timely graduation and developing a well-defined plan for their future. This involves partnering with our high schools and supporting credit recovery programs to help students who may be short on credits, ensuring they have the opportunity to graduate.

For those students opting to enter the workforce post-graduation, our Program will provide valuable assistance in crafting resumes and preparing for employment. Similarly, students pursuing a college or trade program path receive continuous support, with regular check-ins throughout the year to ensure they have access to the necessary resources for success.

Expanding Scholarship Opportunities

We are dedicated to expanding scholarship opportunities for Kids on Course students. Currently, we manage four private scholarship funds directly benefiting our students.
